

Welcome to the 2011 TgR Survey

What is the TgR survey?

This survey takes a snapshot of the gender diverse population in Australia and New Zealand in 2011. It was designed and created by TransGender Radio (www.tgr.net.au)

Participation is strictly anonymous and is being offered only to the 700+ validated members of TgR.

The aims of the survey are to better understand the diversity of our gender diverse community, increase awareness of our community's needs, and identify significant issues of concern.

The survey consists of 8 sections which explore:

- The demographics of our community
- The way we express our true gender identity
- The history of our gender journey
- Our acceptance in society
- The problems we encounter
- Other organisations
- TgR and the internet
- Our hopes for the coming year

How will this survey be reported?

After the survey responses have been collected a report will be prepared for circulation to voluntary and government organisations in Australia.

The report will not include any information that refers to any individual.

It will also be made publicly available on the TgR website.

Access to the raw data may be provided to bona fide researchers who are able to provide assurances of that it will be maintained confidential and copyright.

TgR's commitment to protect your privacy

This survey is completely anonymous. Your answers will not be associated with any information that could trace back to your TgR membership.

There are a number of opportunities in the survey to write additional comments.

To ensure your anonymity, particularly if you are from a small community, please be careful not to include any detail that may offer clues about your identity.

Do I have to answer all the questions?

The survey contains about 40 questions, most are optional. You may not be presented with all the questions - depending on the answers you give. The survey should take less than 30 mins to complete (depending how many questions are appropriate for you to answer). You can leave the survey at any time you wish and restart from where you left off.

If you are short of time, you are encouraged to answer the first question in each section - that's just 8 questions!

It is appreciated that you may not wish to share some particular items of information. This is very much understood.

Partially completed survey responses are better than no response at all!

However please answer as many questions as you can, because the more you contribute, the more representative and accurate the survey results will be.

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Section 1

Demographics

To analyse the results of the survey we do need to know a bit about you first.

Of course, we don't want you to record anything that reveals your identity.

So, in this first section of the survey we are seeking some minimal baseline information about you.

We request that everyone completes the first question below:

Q1 What physical sex was recorded on your Birth Certificate when you were born?

Section 2

Your gender expression

In this section we explore your true gender identity and ask you to tell us how you express it in your life.

By true gender identity we mean the way you feel inside about your gender - not necessarily your current physical sex.

We request that everyone completes the question below.

Q8 What do you feel is your true gender identity?

Note that by true gender identity we mean the way you feel inside about your gender - not necessarily your current physical sex or gender. This definition is used throughout this survey.

For guidance on this question see the help below.

Please choose only one of the following:

- male
- male (with some female aspects)
- neither male nor female
- female (with some male aspects)
- female

To illustrate what is meant by true gender and how it is not related to sexual preference the following examples may help understand the options offered above. But they are only intended as examples - please answer this question as you feel is right for you.

Male: "I'm a man inside. I have a heterosexual preference for women"

Male: "I'm a man inside, but to be honest I prefer men for my friends, in fact I have a steady boyfriend"

Male with some female aspects: "I'm a happily married man and feel comfortable as a man most of the time, but sometimes I feel the need to explore a softer, emotional, empathetic side to my personality and I put on a dress"

Neither male nor female: "To be honest inside I feel as if I am both male and female. I can present as a man or a woman but don't feel totally comfortable with either. I have close relationships with both men and women".

Female with some male aspects: "I'm a woman inside, but sometimes there is a bit of me that is male that I need to express -perhaps I'm just a bit of a tomboy as I like going to watch the footy"

Female: "I'm a woman inside. I'm totally comfortable living as a woman. I have a steady girlfriend."

Note that this question is not asking , for instance, how often you dress in a way associated with someone of the opposite physical sex.

What we are interested in knowing is how often you present to friends and associates in a way that reflects the way you feel inside.
